Pastor Del's peace ...

"We have seen the Lord."

(the disciples to Thomas [John 20:25a])

It was a wonderful Easter celebration this year- a celebration that we began yearning for forty days prior on Ash Wednesday. During that time, we focused on prayer, the kind of prayer that is unspoken. We stopped. We listened. We looked at images that were formed in our minds. And there were moments when we have seen the Lord.

We began Holy Week with the procession of the palms and then an interactive corporate reading of the passion narrative. To the extent that we reflected upon Jesus' abuse and death at the firm grasp of the powers-that-be, we have seen the Lord.

We had another experience during Holy Week in that our Wednesday evening central city community meal celebrated our first anniversary of worship Service. In reflecting upon that meal and the twelve meals prior, upon the diversity of guests, the stories shared and the relationships built, Matthew 25:24 comes to mind: *"Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me."* We have seen the Lord.

Thursday evening was the liturgical enactment of the hands-on experience of Wednesday night. Participating in the washing of feet and the sacrament of Holy Communion is all about making the connection between the actions and teachings of Jesus. Jesus gives us a new command- his final wish for us- that we love one another, as he has loved us.

Jesus' final hours were our meditation on Friday evening. We listen, we sing. The sanctuary becomes darker as the life of Jesus extinguishes. The light is eclipsed.

The vigil of Holy Saturday began in the narthex and with all gathered lighting their candles off the flame of the paschal candle, and we proceeded into the sanctuary. There we listened to stories of God's interaction into the human story- stories of saving acts and promises. With each reading and song, another candle was lit and the light grew. Finally, the good news of the empty tomb was proclaimed



from a fully dressed and lit altar. From the proclamation of the empty tomb, we witnessed the sacrament of Holy Baptism and Cameron received the gift of new life in Christ. We have seen the Lord.

The morning of the first day of the week, in a full and festive sanctuary, we gathered and heard the good news of Jesus being raised up by a mighty act of God. "Do not be afraid," it proclaimed. Jesus is not in a tomb. "He has been raised up and is going ahead of you to Galilee. There you will see him." Yet sandwiched into that sending, Jesus suddenly meets them.

The morning of the Resurrection, we saw many visitors. We hosted many people. In those whom we are coming to know and are coming to know us, we have seen the Lord.

It's still Easter. Pr. Ritva's article addresses one of our next steps on this exciting journey. It's a crucial and important step. We are a Resurrection Church. We are on a journey to Galilee- the place where it all began for us and the place we are sent back to be- the places where the new life given to us by a mighty act of God intersects with everyday life. We have seen the Lord. The path is ahead. The momentum must be maintained. For our story of God must be told.

Pastor Ritva reflects on...

...the e-word

While many of us may think that the “e-word” is scarifying, actually doing real life practical evangelism can be fun and exciting.

Throughout Lent about 50 people at here at Zion studied Martha Grace Reese’s book *Unbinding Your Heart*. We learned why we should share our faith—there are people in our homes, workplaces and neighbors who need Jesus! We practiced sharing our faith with each other in small groups. Many of us even interviewed a person who was either un-churched or de-churched.

Most of all we prayed. We prayed daily alone in our rooms. We prayed together in small groups. We tried different forms of prayer— walking prayer, silent prayer, holding up to the light prayer, imaginative prayer. We prayed! We learned to sit in silence and wait for the Holy Spirit to show us what we needed to do.

Many heard the call to invite someone to church on Easter Sunday. We invited and guess what? 40 visitors came to church, and 5 of those visitors wrote on their communion cards that they are interested in joining this church! How totally awesome is that?!?!

I want to do the happy dance all around my office, shouting “Alleluia! Alleluia!” Being one of those quiet Scandi-hoovian type Lutherans not given to wild displays of emotion, I won’t really do that. But you do get the point. Our first step into the waters of evangelism has turned out pretty well.

So what’s next?

People are already signing up for small groups to study Martha Grace Reese’s follow-up book *Unbinding Your Soul*. Two groups have been formed so far:

- Mondays at 10:30 a.m. (May 2-23)
- Wednesdays at 7:00 p.m. (May 4-25)

God is truly working amazing things in this place. Again thank you for your help support and the compassion and love you share with our community.



Food Pantry: The food pantry continues to be a busy ministry to our neighborhood and the community.

This ministry provides food to our friends and neighbors in their time of need. God has called us to this neighborhood

and this ministry to serve and one of the ways we serve is to help provide nourishment to the body. As we provide for the needs of the body we are also given opportunity to reflect the love of Christ in some other very simple ways such as a handshake, a smile or an encouraging word. Through the food pantry we too receive back that love of Christ through the trust and new friendships we are developing with our neighbors. The call to minister to each other is a call from God 1 John 4:19(NRSV) says, "We love because he first loved us." Thus, in a simple concrete way through the ministry of sharing food we show God's caring love for one another.

On Monday and Wednesday 3:30-5:00 the pantry crew prepares and distributes food boxes to our neighbors. There are many ways to be of service at Zion. I encourage you to listen to where the Spirit might be leading you.

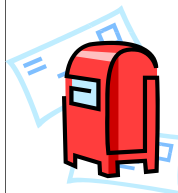

On the Global front ...



Zion's Global Ministry team is working on a three-year mutual covenant relationship with the people of Haiti through Beyond Borders, a non-profit organization.

Mr. Sam Stephens, Director of Development for Beyond Borders, will be at Zion the weekend of May 14-15; he will share information about Beyond Borders and our joining in their partnerships of Hope during our **worship service and the "FaithTalk" forum.** He will also share information about **transformational travel to Haiti** through Beyond Borders.

Beyond Borders is an international non—profit organization dedicated to strengthening movements in Haiti that liberate people from isolation and oppression. Based in Washington DC, they have operated on the ground in Haiti since 1993. For the past two years they have also worked directly with Haiti Partners in Haiti. **Beyond Borders' mission statement is, "working in Haiti for justice and peace out of devotion to Christ."**

They make a difference in Haiti because of the approach they take, following the Haitian proverb, "The rock in the water doesn't understand the misery of the rock in the sun." They know that any lasting change in Haiti must come from within, led by the people of Haiti. They work hand-in-hand with the Haitian people, understanding that the Haitian people know how to best address the issues they face. They provide them with the resources they need to build grassroots, community-based movements that lead to sustainable, positive change.

Beyond Borders is currently strengthening movements to:

- End child slavery and other practices that imperil children;
- Guarantee universal access to quality education;
- End violence against women and girls;
- Replace systems that oppress the poor with systems that support dignified work and sustainable livelihoods
- Transform the traditional mission mentality of one-way benevolence to one based on mutual respect, deep solidarity, and justice.

Working with Beyond Borders' Partners of Hope, Zion will partner with a classroom of children in a school in Meno (*pronounced Mayno*), just south of the capital Port-au-Prince. This school was destroyed in the earthquake and has been partially rebuilt. In our three-year covenant we will seek to commit \$200 per month which will cover:

- Teacher training and salary
- Books for children
- School supplies
- **The classroom's share of administration expenses**

Beyond Borders Partnership ensures that each class receives a quality education and the children have opportunity to succeed by giving them resources they need to do so. Beyond Borders covers classrooms not sponsored until sponsors are found so that all classes receive evenly and fairly. We will seek ways to interact with our class, with pictures, newsletters, and more—we'll see where **God's Spirit leads us in ideas.**

A portion of our Lenten offerings is our beginning "seed money."

Please mark your calendars for May 15th and pray about a calling to walk with the people of Haiti in this way in the name and love of Jesus.

As a special related request, we are asking if any of you would be willing to be a pray-er for this covenant relationship, for **"our class in Haiti," and for the people of Haiti.** That's all ... but that's also a lot to God.
